## *From the Pastor . . .*

More than some may realize, many good things take place in our church. Our church has long been known for an excellent music ministry. In addition to the evidence of this we see on Sunday mornings, the annual August concert at the Mesquite Arts Center is another example. But another thing we can be grateful for here is an outstanding youth ministry. I have thought about that particularly this summer as I have observed what is really a nice group of young people in our church. In fact, I was impressed that many of them sat together on the first two rows at the 11:00 o'clock service last Sunday.

In June, sixteen of our teens were involved in a mission trip to San Antonio where, among other things, they worked at the San Antonio Food Bank and helped with repairs for low-income and disabled homeowners. Our youth will be helping with a similar program in our own community when they participate in "Addressing Mesquite" this October.

In July, eleven of our youth attended Synod Youth Workshop at our Presbyterian-related University of Tulsa where they participated in Bible study, community building, and service projects.

And then our church was also represented at the Presbyterian Youth Triennium on the campus of Purdue University. This event held every three years brings Presbyterian young people together from all over the world for worship, Bible study, and recreation.

This coming November the Office of Youth Ministries of our national Presbyterian Church and the Presbyterian Youth Workers Association will have a planning retreat in Texas. Our Director of Christian Education, Cynthia Petty, has been asked to be a member of the host team and they will meet August 14-16 in New Braunfels to finalize plans for the event. I am grateful to Cynthia and to a loving, caring group
