From the Pastor . . .

A recent headline in *The Dallas Morning News* should make us all pause and think. The headline said "Texas leads the nation in drunken driving fatalities." Another unfortunate statistic is that Dallas County is ranked second in the country for DWI fatalities and injuries. It seems that almost every week-end there is a story on the news about someone who has been injured or killed by an intoxicated driver – and those are just the ones who make the news. I have become particularly aware of three such cases recently, one in which a woman was hit by a drunken driver and her car caught on fire. Aside from excruciating pain from her burns, her face was terribly disfigured and she has had to go through numerous surgeries.

The second case involved a nice young woman, Jackie Murphery, in Wise County who was an outstanding graduate at Decatur High School and was looking forward to going to college this fall. A few weeks ago while on the way to work at 8:30 in the morning, her car was hit by a drunken driver and she has been in a coma ever since. What a tragedy for her and for her family. The woman who hit her even smiled for the mug shot.

The third case is that of Paige Owens, a 15 year old girl from Keller, who is now paralyzed from the neck down. A convenience store apparently sold alcohol to some underage friends of hers which led to a car crash on August 4. Ironically, Paige wasn't one of the ones who was drinking that night. Seeing her and her parents interviewed on TV was heart-rending, and I have had them in my prayers. Her life and the life of four other teens were changed in an instant. The driver of the car and two other youths were killed.

Glynn Birch, president of Mothers Against Drunk Driving, said that 97% of Americans view drunken driving as a threat to their families and themselves. And he added: "They should be afraid. The results of drunk driving are devastating." One law enforcement

official said recently that if they wanted to, the Texas Legislature could do a lot to help solve the DWI problem, but they don't want to. One wonders how many people have to be injured and die before our society really decides to get serious about this problem.

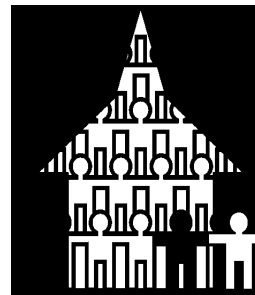
Presbyterian Women Work Day
