Session Highlights

The October 10 meeting of the Session began with the sharing of prayer concerns.

Pete Allen, the church treasurer, reported that the average weekly offering for September was slightly below what is needed to make the church budget but that for the we were still meeting the budget.

Donna Barron, Chair of the Church Budget and Stewardship Committee, presented the proposed church budget as approved by the Board of Deacons. The budget of \$509,155 was approved.

Duane Moon, Chairman of the Christian Education Committee reported that 50 teens and adults were part of the Church Under the Bridge mission project in September. Wednesday Church Night has gotten off to a good start. Duane also said that our DCE, Cynthia Petty, has been asked to be part of a team of six to eight people from Grace Presbytery to write a new curriculum for senior highs for our national church.

Margie Pollard, Chair of the Communion Committee, said the World Communion Services on October 7 went well and communion was taken to shut-ins that afternoon who requested it.

Roger Foltz, Chairman of the Mission Committee, said that 23 people participated in the blood drive and that 43 of our members had signed up to help with Addressing Mesquite Day. The committee is working on the Thanksgiving basket project for Sharing Life Community Outreach.

Johnny Graham, Chairman of the Worship Committee, reported that the new chairs for the Chancel are here. He also said that Verlyn Smoker spoke of the \$14,000 needed for the youth music ministry tour in June. The Session voted to receive an offering at the Christmas Eve services to help with this. Verlyn also told about plans for special music on Reformation Sunday on October 28.

The Morning Circle will meet Tuesday, November 6, at 9:30. Cora Dugan will lead the Bible study and Nickie Wilbanks will serve as hostess.

The Night Circle will meet the same day at 7:00 with Len McCurdy serving as Bible study leader.

Do you buy groceries?
